The permittee shall, not less than once per year, (with the DMR due on January 28th of each year), certify that chemicals added for cooling tower maintenance, including such chemicals used for corrosion inhibition, do not result in the discharge via cooling tower blowdown of any of the 126 priority pollutants (excluding chromium and zinc) in detectable concentrations. Additionally, once for each product used for cooling tower maintenance (unless subsequent changes in the product formulation occur or, the product is obtained from a different source), compliance shall be demonstrated by submission of certification from the manufacturer that such product contains no priority pollutants or, if any of the 126 priority pollutants are contained in such product, calculations which show that the addition of such product does not result in the discharge of that individual priority pollutant at concentrations greater than 10 micrograms per liter due to dilution within the cooling system. 	The permittee shall give notice to the Permit Board as soon as possible of any planned physical alterations or additions, including but not limited to, a change of operation to the permitted facility. Notice is required in the circumstances that follow: (1) The alteration or addition to a permitted facility may meet one of the criteria for determining whether the facility is a new source in 40 CFR 122.29(b); or (2) The alteration or addition could significantly change the nature or increase the quantity of pollutants discharged. This notification applies to pollutants which are not subject to either effluent limitations in the permit or notification requirements under 40 CFR 122.42(a)(1). 	(1) The permittee shall report any noncompliance which may endanger health or the environment.
